Park News

- **The Point at Cape Henlopen, including a stretch of ocean beach and dunes, and a half mile along the bay shoreline closed March 1 for the benefit of threatened and endangered nesting migratory shorebirds and will reopen in the Fall.**
- **Two buoyant mine casings and two mine anchors dating from the 1940's were discovered just north of the fishing pier and will be displayed inside Battery 519 starting April 25th.**
- **Park maintenance picked up a 1986 Chevy 4WD utility truck from Ft. Delaware which will allow a fully stocked vehicle to drive down the beach if needed in an emergency.**

PARK NEWS

A design for a new 6 mile trail has been finalized for CHSP with a trailhead off Wolfe Neck Road. The new loop will double the length of the existing 6 mile Junction-and-Breakwater Trail linking Lewes and Rehoboth Beach. The design includes converting 400 acres of farmland to reforested woodlands, returning the land to a natural state and providing public access to parts of CHSP that have been closed for two decades.

Due to the current pandemic the May 9 TRAILS DAY is cancelled

WHO WE ARE

The FOCHSP conducts a number of ongoing activities and events, including our very popular Osprey Cam and our borrow-a-bike program, which provides free loaner bikes to Park visitors; the monthly Trails Day maintenance and cleanup of Park trails; and a series of well-attended fundraising events including our annual Flea Market; Wine, Beer and Cheese Tasting; Youth Fishing Tournament; and Chocolate Tasting. Recent Park investments by FOCHSP include the children's playground (along with its annual maintenance), sponsorship of the main beach lifeguard stands, Mobi-Mats at several dune crossings, beach wheelchairs, and purchase of and support for Vos, the K-9 recently added to Park enforcement staff. FOCHSP also provides scholarships to Title I schools to offset the cost of travel and Park entrance fees so children can participate in a number of Nature Center educational programs throughout the year.


