Rehoboth Beach Seashore Marathon December 4, 2021



Get to Know Our Members – Gavin Braithwaite

Gavin was born and raised on a dairy farm in the southwest of England. That's what inspired his love of nature and the outdoors.

In 1976, after spending some time in northern Argentina's cattle country, Gavin's British employer sent him to Wilmington, Delaware USA.


With a career background as a veterinarian, specializing in entomology research, ticks started out to be Gavin's thing, but from there he moved on to flies, fleas, mange...and the rest is history. In 1992 Gavin left the corporate world and moved to Lewes with his wife Lou to start their new careers as small business owners. In that year they opened two downtown Lewes shops, The Stepping Stone and PUZZLES.

In the mid '90s, Gavin and Lou were recruited into FOCHSP by Mirth and Dick Thatcher to help with wine and cheese fundraisers. They supplied the cheese which fell right into their line of expertise as they owned and operated Lewes Gourmet.

But their familiarity with the park goes way back before that, as Lou was on the park's Master Plan Steering Committee in the early '90s. Later Gavin became "pen-pals" with then-Governor Ruth Ann Minner, as a group of members were pushing back against proposals to blacktop the Gordons Pond Trail.

Today, Gavin spends most of his time as a Bike Barn Ambassador and leading groups on the monthly Trail Days. Not to mention lending a hand with signage and set-up for fundraising events.





FOCHSP Trail Days February 12, 2022

The FOCHSP Feb 2022 Trail Days had 29 volunteers who performed a total of 52.5 hours of volunteer work. The team met at the Gordons Pond parking lot (Whiskey beach) and split up into three crews. Crew one cleaned brush and sight lines at the Gordon Pond trailhead. The second crew trimmed brush, cleared pine needles from the path and picked up trash to the bird lookout area, The third group picked up about **40 POUNDS** of trash around the parking lot, entrance road and pavilion.



Park Updates


- Normal Park entry fees took effect March 1 and are enforced until November 30.


Helping Hands- Dogfish Head Benevolence Volunteers April 21, 2022

FOCHSP Community Efforts

The Friends board recently updated the Thatcher Grant and created an all-new grant that is non-profit centric called the YES (Youth Education Support) Grant. Both programs help the youth of our community learn more about nature, the environment and what makes our park special.

The **Thatcher Grant** program is designed to encourage local youth groups to come to the Park to participate in environmental educational programs that align with the Friends mission of furthering the appreciation, enhancement and maintenance of Cape Henlopen State Park. The grant is administered by the FOCHSP in coordination with Cape Henlopen State Park leadership and covers school transportation costs to the Park and/or Seaside Nature Center program fees. Drawing from a fund established by Richard and Mirth Thatcher and supplemented each year by donations and some FOCHSP fund-raising event proceeds, Title 1 (financially disadvantaged student population) Delaware schools submit applications to the Park Nature Center Manager for resource review. Upon manager approval, applications are forwarded to the FOCHSP board which determines if Thatcher Grant criteria are met and sufficient funds (which are limited) are available, prior to approval or rejection. On approval, bussing costs are paid directly to the applying school while program fees are paid directly to the Park.

The **YES Grant** offers financial support to youth groups that come to the Park to participate in programs that align with the Friends mission. The grant covers transportation to and from the Park and/or expenses for activities while in the Park. YES funds are limited and are granted preferentially to groups that have restricted financial resources and are led/sponsored by a current FOCHSP member. All youth groups must be non-profits based in Delaware. Each youth group can receive only 1 YES grant in each calendar year. Applications are submitted to the Seaside Nature Center Manager for resource review at least 1 month prior to the proposed event date. Upon manager approval, applications are forwarded to the FOCHSP board which determines if Yes Grant criteria are met and sufficient funds (which are limited) are available, prior to approval or rejection. On approval, bussing costs are paid directly to the applying school while program fees are paid directly to the Park.

FOCHSP Trail Days May 21, 2022

The FOCHSP monthly Trails Day had 14 volunteers who cleaned and pruned along the Walking Dunes trail, the Youth Camp path and the bike and MTB paths from Transmitter Road to Herring Point. A total of 40.25 hours were done. We took out as many wineberry shrubs/sprouts as possible. Doesn't our crew look impressive in their fashionable safety vests?

National Trails Day June 4, 2022

As part of this year's National Trails Day cleanup, the Friends of Cape Henlopen State Park were joined by the Zwaanendael Women's club, Camp Rehoboth and the Rehoboth Village Improvement Assoc. Together our mighty band of 78 volunteers put in 234.5 hours of work cleaning up the bay and ocean beaches in Cape Henlopen state park. Approx. 80 lbs. of trash were collected. We also repaired fencing on the beach access from the Hawk Watch. The event included a delicious lunch provided by the Rehoboth Village Improvement Assoc. Interesting finds included a tagged horseshoe crab along the bay beach and an old friend of trail leader Gavin Braithwaite.





The Horseshoe Crab - Ancient Wonder of the Delaware Bay By Donna Lee

The Delaware Bay is home to the largest population of horseshoe crabs in the U.S. The Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission's Horseshoe Crab Management Board estimates that there are 21.9 million males and 9.4 million females. Males start to breed at maturity, around 8 years, and the females breed around 10 years.

Horseshoe crabs are called "living fossils" whose ancestors date back to the age of the dinosaurs, about 450 million years ago. Our local species is *Limulus polyphemus*, which is found on the Atlantic coast from southern Maine to the Yucatan Peninsula, with the Delaware Bay as the center of the population.

There are four main species of horseshoe crabs: the other three species are near the Philippines and the Indonesian Islands, the Bay of Bengal and in the waters off Japan. Japan once had a thriving population of horseshoe crabs but overdevelopment has reduced the population to a few thousand crabs.

In 2002 the horseshoe crab was named the official marine animal of the state of Delaware, in recognition of its importance to the ecology of the Delaware Bay, as well as its importance to human health. (Source: Sea Grant Delaware Marine Advisory Service Bulletin (48-1216-567-5K) - Horseshoe Crab by William R. Hall Jr.)

According to the Horseshoe Crab Recovery Coalition (<u>www.hscrabrecovery.org</u>) the horseshoe crab is a keystone species as an ecosystem has evolved around their breeding season. Migratory birds have adapted their northbound journey to coincide with the spawn of eggs, which is a critical source of fuel for their several-thousand-mile journey. The population of Red Knot sandpipers has declined by 75% at key stopover points like the Delaware Bay since 2000 according to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. In addition to feeding the birds, the eggs are a calorie dense food source for fish and turtles.

The Sea Grant publication says that scientists believe females may deposit 90,000 or more eggs during the spawning season, and only 33 out of a million eggs survive the first year.

Horseshoe Crabs at Cape Henlopen State Park

According to Kathleen LaForce, an enthusiastic Interpreter at Cape Henlopen State Park, the bay side of the park is an acceptable breeding area for the horseshoe crabs, because there is less salinity and smaller waves than the beach side. Some of the other Delaware beaches such as Slaughter Beach and Bowers Beach have even more desirable spawning conditions with more brackish water and more silt than sand on the beaches. The Cape Henlopen State Park staff has been conducting horseshoe crab counts for many years and report that overall, the numbers seem to have stabilized.

The horseshoe crabs are dormant in the winter and stay at the lower levels of the bay where the water temperature is constant.

In 2001, the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission set aside hundreds of square miles in the Atlantic Ocean off the New Jersey and Delaware coasts as the "Carl N. Shuster, Jr., Horseshoe Crab Reserve," as part of the commission's coast-wide management plan for horseshoe crabs. By protecting a large population of overwintering adult and sub-adult horseshoe crabs from harvest, this reserve has played a huge role in helping rebuild and sustain spawning capacities of Limulus. Carl N. Shuster, Jr., Ph.D., was the renowned "founding father" of horseshoe crab science. (Source: https://horseshoecrab.org/press/2020/08/Estuary-News-Summer-2020 Schuster.pdf)

Delaware Horseshoe Crab Surveys

Cape Henlopen State Park is one of many locations for horseshoe crab surveys done during the mating season in May and June. Currently the Cape Henlopen State Park staff does the surveys there, but other groups are open to volunteers including the Delaware Center for Inland Bays. The surveys run for two lunar cycles, surveying two days before and after the full moon.

According to the Nature Conservancy, there are 23 crab surveys in Delaware and New Jersey. You can find the survey reports and other information on this website: <u>https://www.delawarebayhscsurvey.org/surveyreports</u>

The 2019 survey reported that in New Jersey the sex ratio of males to females decreased to 4.74 while in Delaware it increased to 6.05 males to females.

Another important part of the surveys is tagging of horseshoe crabs. If you are lucky enough to find a tagged crab, send the information to the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service and they will send you information about the crab, a certificate, and a pin.

Horseshoe crab threats

From the 1850s to the 1920s, between 1.5 million and 2 million Atlantic horseshoe crabs were harvested annually for fertilizer and livestock feed, according to Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission documents. The harvest dropped through the 1950s and stopped in the 1960s, then began again in the 1970s.

Between 1970 and 1990, the reported annual commercial harvest ranged from less than 20,000 pounds to more than 2 million pounds. A need for bait in the whelk fishery likely caused a rise in the horseshoe crab harvest in the 1990s, with a peak of 6 million pounds in 1997. Since the mid- to late-1990s, horseshoe crabs have been sold primarily as bait for the American eel and whelk fisheries and for use in biomedical toxin testing.

Beginning with the 2016 fishing season, the Delaware Bay area harvest has been limited to 500,000 male horseshoe crabs—and zero female horseshoe crabs. The harvest is allocated among the four states that take crabs from the Delaware Bay population: New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, and Virginia.

The Horseshoe Crab - Ancient Wonder of the Delaware Bay By Donna Lee (cont.)

Horseshoe crabs also face a large threat from biomedical labs that collect the crabs for their copperbased blue blood.


The crabs are taken by drug companies for an enzyme, *limulus amebocyte lysate* (LAL), in their blood, used to test injectable drugs and medical devices for harmful bacterial endotoxins. The endotoxins can cause life-threatening illnesses in humans, including toxic shock. LAL reacts with bacterial endotoxin lipopolysaccharide, revealing the presence of endotoxins.

Current practices to supply the global demand for amebocyte lysate results in upwards of 600,000 horseshoe crabs harvested every year. The crabs are transported to the laboratory, bled for amebocyte extraction, and then returned to the sea. With an estimated mortality rate of 10% to 30%, this process is not sustainable.

Get to Know Our Park Staff – Kelsey Doyle

Though born in NYC, up until April of this year, Kelsey Doyle lived in Fort Pierce, Florida all her life. After finishing her bachelor's degree, Kelsey started working in volunteer management within the Florida Park Service. Her most notable position was Director of the Environmental Education Center at Savannas Preserve State Park. There Kelsey recruited, trained, and scheduled volunteers across all departments at the park. Daily managing a team of 40 volunteers, a handful of larger volunteer groups, 8 Hosts as well as public service days has given her the training she needed to become Regional Manager of Volunteers with the Delaware Park System in May 2022. Kelsey works between four parks, Cape Henlopen, Delaware Seashore, Killens Pond, and Trap Pond where she coordinates group volunteer service projects and individual volunteers as well as attending meetings and events for 6 different Friends' groups. Kelsey likes playing an active role in conservation, preservation and maintenance and her position gives her the opportunity to both coordinate behind the scenes as well as getting-her-hands-dirty out in the parks. Though Kelsey hasn't had too much time to explore all the corners of CHSP yet, her favorite area so far is Artillery Park at Fort Miles. As a former ROTC student and Florida Army National Guardsmen, learning about military tactics and equipment in a classroom is a very different experience from seeing it in person.



The Case for Native Plants- A Call for Rediscovery By Julie Callahan



One of the great joys of suburban gardening is finding new and lovely flowers and shrubs. Gardening catalogs are filled with images of hybrids with ever larger, more intricate, and colorful blossoms. Flipping through those catalogs can make a gardener's heart race at the prospect of adding some of these gorgeous plants to the garden.

If one reads the description of these plants, however, it is likely the plant originated from another continent or is a modification of a native plant that renders its appearance and structure much different from the original. The unfortunate and unintended result of filling one's garden with such plants is that the amount of native plant biomass available to feed insects is diminished. While we have become more aware of the decline in bee populations and the detrimental effects this could have on our food supply, a

significant parallel decline in insect populations due to loss of native plants is contributing to an alarming decrease in bird populations.

What is a native plant?

Native North American plants are defined as those that were present in a particular region (Northeast, Southeast, etc.) before European settlement began. These plants developed with the insects, birds, and other elements of the ecosystem for millions of years after the North American continent split away from Europe and Africa during Pangea. As a result, many insects became plant specialists, feeding exclusively on one or a small set of "host" plants containing chemicals that provided nutrition and was not toxic to the insect. For example, the native Passion-Vine with its lovely intricate blossom is a host plant to the caterpillars of at least three butterflies. However, the red Passion-Vine that is native to South America is toxic if eaten by the very same type caterpillars and will cause death. Unfortunately, an insect cannot quickly alter the food adaptations it developed over millions of years. If a native food source is not available, the dependent insect cannot survive. This is an enormous problem for birds.

Insects, nourished by native plants, feed our birds. While birds do consume seeds and berries, insects, particularly caterpillars, are loaded with fats and proteins that are an essential part of a bird's diet. Multiple species of birds have been observed feeding their chicks several thousand caterpillars during their pre-flight development. Breeding chickadees feed their clutch between six and nine thousand caterpillars while they are in the nest. Why? Caterpillars are a high value soft food for a baby bird's tender and growing body. Since a parent bird must locate and retrieve so many caterpillars for its young, this means the bird must have an abundant nearby food source. If native plants have been replaced by non-native ornamentals or removed for development, few insects will be present, and the bird will go elsewhere, or even worse, fail to reproduce.

The Impact

Long-term studies indicate that there has been a net loss of 2.9 billion birds in the US and Canada since 1970, an astounding reduction of 29%. While scientists have identified multiple reasons for this decline, the elimination of native plants through habitat fragmentation and replacement with non-native plants is one of the principal factors.

What can we do?

The situation is dire, but there are many things we can do:

- Incorporate native plants in garden beds. Just a few square feet of a flowering native host plant can feed caterpillars, provide pollen and nectar to bees, and produce seeds for birds to consume in the winter.
- Coordinate with neighbors in your planting effort to create a larger insect hospitable zone. Great native candidates are: Coneflower, Sunflower, Penstemon, False Nettle, False Indigo, Joe-Pye Weed, New England Aster, Butterfly Weed, and Milkweed, the sole host plant for our beloved Monarch butterfly caterpillars. (While common milkweed tends to take over a flower bed through rhizomes, there are other non-spreading native milkweeds available.)
- Reduce the amount of turf grass by expanding existing plant beds or creating new ones. Grass requires 20 to 60 percent more water to maintain than native plants and water is a precious resource. What's more, turf grass treated with chemicals deters insect life. There are many native grasses and sedges which are butterfly host plants that also provide cover for birds, seeds, and nesting material while also lending visual interest to garden beds.
- Encourage landscapers to suggest native plants that would be appropriate for your yard. Crape Myrtles, Chinese hollies, and Japanese barberry are not native, and Japanese barberry is considered invasive. While these plants have adapted well to our environment, and are often admired for their ease of care, they are likely inedible or even poisonous to native insects.
- Perform yard clean-up in the spring after temperatures reach the mid-fifties. Many insects overwinter in the hollow stems of plants or in fallen leaf matter. Performing yard clean-up in the fall will result in discarding the insects that the native plants attracted.
- Leave the last spent blossoms on flower stems for birds to consume during the winter.
- Limit or phase out pesticide use.
- Plant an oak tree. Oak trees support 897 caterpillar species, the largest number of any native tree. Fallen acorns also feed birds, squirrels, raccoons, and deer. Small, medium, and large oak tree varieties can accommodate a range of yard sizes.








Get to Know Our Members – Tom Nelson
